

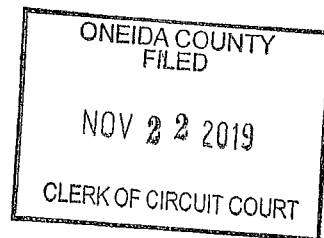

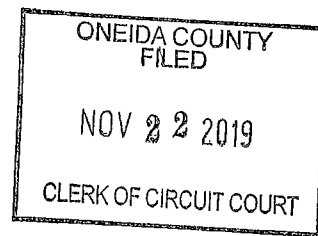

WHEREAS, Captain Terri Hook has this day complained in writing, to the said court upon oath that on the 18th day of November, A.D., 2019, in and upon the premises in the City of Rhinelander in Oneida County, WI, located at 135 South Stevens Street and more particularly described as follows:

A multi-level red brick business building with a sign on the front entrance that reads "Rhinelander City Hall" to include the office of the City Administrator ~~located on the second floor~~, the office of the Mayor ~~located on the first floor~~ and the secured area in the basement of the building to include the locked room and the archived emails or back up emails from 2019 with the computer server or held by the City of Rhinelander that are believed to be contained within the Barracuda application utilized by the City of Rhinelander to archive emails (public records).

There are now located and concealed certain things, to wit:

Copies of any and all written disciplinary records and documentation involving any investigations conducted into any adverse entries therein, made against Public Works Director Tim Kingman between January 1, 2017 and July 23, 2018 located within personnel files of Tim Kingman, Tony Gilman, Edward Underwood, Justin Ernst, Tom Roeser Joel Halminiak as well as documents or emails created or sent from the computer of Daniel Guild about Tim Kingman or Tim Kingman's personnel file.

possessed for the purpose of evading or violating the laws of the State of Wisconsin and contrary to Section 946.72 of the Wisconsin Statutes or, which things were used in the commission of or, may constitute evidence of a crime, to wit: Tampering with Public Records and Notices .

Committed in violation of Section 946.72(1) of the Wisconsin Statutes and prayed that a search warrant be issued to search said person and motor vehicle for said property.

NOW, therefore, in the name of the State of Wisconsin you are commanded forthwith to search for the said items, and if the same or any portion thereof are found, to bring the same and the person in whose possession the same are found, and return this warrant within 48 hours before the said court (or, before the Circuit court for Oneida County), to be dealt with according to law.

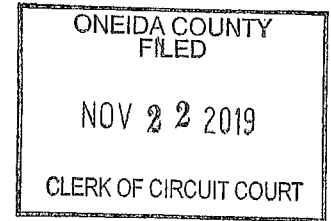

WHEREAS, Captain Teresa M. Hook, on this date, being duly sworn, states that on November 19, 2019, in and upon the premises in the City of Rhinelander, located at 135 South Stevens Street, more particularly described as:

A multi-level red brick business building with a sign on the front entrance that reads "Rhinelander City Hall" to include the office of the City Administrator located on the second floor, the office of the Mayor located on the first floor and the secured area in the basement of the building to include the locked room and the archived emails or back up emails from 2019 with the computer server or held by the City of Rhinelander that are believed to be contained within the Barracuda application utilized by the City of Rhinelander to archive emails (public records).

There are now located in and upon the person certain items to wit:

Copies of any and all written disciplinary records and documentation involving any investigations conducted into any adverse entries therein, made against Public Works Director Tim Kingman between January 1, 2017 and July 23, 2018 located within personnel files of Tim Kingman, Tony Gilman, Edward Underwood, Justin Ernst, Tom Roeser Joel Halminiak as well as documents or emails created or sent from the computer of Daniel Guild about Tim Kingman or Tim Kingman's personnel file.

possessed by the record custodian, Daniel R. Guild, M/W, 12/09/79, in support of the crime of Tampering with Public Records and Notices, in violation of the laws of Wisconsin, contrary to Sect. 946.72(1) of Wisconsin State Statutes.

The Facts tending to establish grounds for issuing a search warrant are as follows:

1. I am a Captain employed by the Oneida County Sheriff's Office and assigned to the Detective Bureau. My assignment has included the investigation of major

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crimes to include all felony investigations. I have been a law enforcement officer for twenty-four and have been assigned to the Detective Bureau for the last fourteen years. My jurisdiction includes Oneida County and the City of Rhinelander.

2. I have also attended numerous hours of training in the area of felony crimes as well as specific training on Wisconsin public records laws. These training include training from the Wisconsin Department of Justice, Fox Valley Technical College, Milwaukee Area Technical College, Wisconsin Office of Justice Assistance, Children's Hospital of Wisconsin, University of Wisconsin Oshkosh, the Wisconsin State Crime Lab and the Oneida County Sheriff's Office. I have arrested person for felony crimes and these arrests have led to convictions in State Court . Based upon my training, my participation in other investigations involving death investigation and my conversations with experienced investigators, I know that:

- a.) Public records are defined in Wisconsin statute 19.32(2) as "any material on which written, drawn, printed, spoken, visual, or electromagnetic information of electronically generated or stored data is recorded or preserved, regard less of physical form or characteristics, which has been created or is being kept by an authority. Personnel records fall into this definition of a record.

- b) The City of Rhinelander is an authority as defined in Wisconsin Statute 19.32(1).

- c) The Northwoods River News is a "requester" as defined by Wisconsin Statute 19.32(3).

- d) Wisconsin Statute 19.33(4) allows every authority to designate in writing the employee of the authority that is the legal custodian of records.

- e) Wisconsin Statute 19.21(1) requires the legal custodians of records to keep safe and preserve all records that are kept in the officer's office or which are in the possession or control of the office or the officer's deputies.

- f) Wisconsin Statute 19.21(4)(b) requires public records be kept for 7 years.

- g) If a document is created on a computer, there will be a record of the document with as a saved document or on a keystroke logger. Many governmental agencies will put keystroke logger

3. On September 4, 2019, the Oneida County Sheriff's Office received a complaint from Gregg Walker, the owner of Northwoods River News. The complaint involved an open records request delivered to Valerie Foley, the City Clerk for the City of Rhinelander by the Northwoods River News in writing on July 23, 2018 by his reporter Jamie Taylor for "any and all written disciplinary records and documentation involving

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any investigation conducted into any adverse complaints therein, made against Public Works Director tim Kingman between January 1, 2107 to present.” Walker reported the City of Rhinelander provided a written response to their request on August 3, 2018 that stated, “The City has identified at least one document that may be responsive to your request.” Walker reported that on August 1, 2019, his reporter, Jaime Taylor received an email stating, “The City has not located any records responsive to your July 23, 2018 request.” The response went on to further explain that the personnel file of Tim Kingman was inappropriately removed from the City’s files.

4. On September 12, 2019, Detective Sergeant Barbour interviewed Greg Walker and Jamie Taylor about the open records request. Taylor had received information that the personnel files were locked in City Administrator Daniel Guild’s Office. During this conversation, Taylor and Walker reported they were concerned that a crime may have been committed in that the personnel file may have been potentially stolen and or tampered with.

5. On October 18, 2019, Captain Tyler Young and I were requested to continue this investigation. In a review of the City of Rhinelander Ordinances, we determined that according to Ordinance 2.03.07, all records pertaining to personnel issues shall be officially recorded in the City Administrator’s Office. City of Rhinelander Ordinance 2.01.23(4)(c) requires the City Administrator to “serve as personnel officer for the City with responsibilities to see that complete and accurate personnel records, including specific job descriptions, for all City employees are kept.” City of Rhinelander Ordinance 2.01.43(4)(b) requires the City Administrator has the responsibility to the City Council to “Keep the Mayor and Council regularly informed about the activities of the Administrator’s office by oral or written report at regular and special meetings with the Council.”

6. On September 17, 2019 and again on October 23, 2019, investigators spoke with Valerie Foley, the City of Rhinelander Clerk. Foley stated that Foley is the authority within the City of Rhinelander that receives open records requests. Foley said once Foley receives the request, Foley forwards the request to whichever area of the City the request is referring to. Foley said the information is then sent back to Foley and Foley will deliver it to the requester. Foley said currently, she does not receive all the requests. Foley said Foley has become aware that requests are being sent through the Mayor or the City Administrator.

Foley was shown the open records request date July 23, 2018. Foley said this is the common type of request she receives from The Northwoods River News for information. Foley said she would not be the person to fill this request as the personnel records are locked in the City Administrator’s Office. Foley said at the time this request came in, there was not a City Administrator so it would have been sent to Carrie Miljevich, as she had been the City of Rhinelander Attorney.

When shown the response on August 3, 2018, Foley stated this was a standard response that would be prepared by the legal counsel for the City and Foley or her assistant would sign the document and deliver it to the requester. Foley said Foley was aware this letter had been prepared by Miljevich.

Foley was shown the email sent to Jamie Taylor on August 1, 2019 by Daniel Guild. Foley said she was not involved in the preparation of this email. Foley said she was not involved in this request as the City Administrator is in possession of the personnel files.

Foley reported to the investigators that the computer server for the City of Rhinelander is kept in the basement of city hall in a locked room. Foley said there are keys to the secured area of the basement in the vault that is in Foley's office.

Foley is believed to be truthful and reliable in that Foley is a city official giving information about Foley's duties.

7. On October 22, 2019, Captain Young and I interviewed Carrie Miljevich. Miljevich was the City of Rhinelander Attorney from November 18, 2013 through May 31, 2019. Miljevich was able to provide the investigators with information about how personnel issues were handled at the City of Rhinelander. Miljevich stated that when there is a City Administrator, the City Administrator deals with all of the personnel issues. Miljevich stated there were several periods during her tenure as the City Attorney where there was no a City Administrator. During this time, the City received direction from the City and Villages Mutual Insurance Company about how to handle personnel complaints. Miljevich stated Miljevich, the Mayor, and the Chairperson of the City Council became the committee that investigated these complaints. Miljevich explained the committee would meet with the complaining employee and then the employee who was the subject of the complaint. Miljevich stated they then interviewed any witnesses to the incidents or issues that were being reported. Miljevich said a decision would be made and all of this information would be documented. Miljevich said there would be documentation from the investigation in the employee personnel file of the employee who filed the complaint as well as the personnel file of the person who the complaint was filed against.

Miljevich stated this committee had dealt with several incidents involving Tim Kingman and other employees from August 16, 2016 through February 2017 and from April 25, 2018 through September 2018 as there was not a City Administrator during these periods. Miljevich specifically remembers dealing with incidents involving Tim Kingman, and Tony Gilman, Tom Roeser, Ed Underwood, Kristina Aschenbrenner and Justin Ernst. Miljevich said she believed there should be documents in all of these files involving investigations involving Kingman.

Miljevich said when Daniel Guild was hired as the City Administrator, there was still an open investigation into an issue between Kingman and Joseph Patrone. Miljevich said Miljevich turned over all the information Miljevich had about the issue to Guild and Guild blind-copied Miljevich in on an email Guild sent to Patrone explaining that as Guild was now the “chief personnel officer” and Guild would be dealing with the issues.

Miljevich told the investigators that personnel files are kept in the City Administrators Office. Miljevich said when there has not been a City Administrator, the administrative assistant for the City Administrator had the keys to the locked filing cabinet in the City Administrator’s office.

Miljevich is believed to be truthful and reliable in that Miljevich was a city employee and is giving information about the duties she performed.

8. On October 22, 2019, Captain Young and I spoke with Keith Kost. Kost was the City of Rhinelander City Administrator from February 2017 until April 25, 2018. Kost told investigators the personnel files are kept locked in the City Administrator’s Office. Kost said Kost’s office remained lock while he was the City Administrator. Kost said the keys to the file were kept in the administrative assistant’s desk. Kost said the administrative assistant’s desk was locked when they were not at work. Kost said there were times when Kost could not access the files because Kost’s assistant was not at work. Kost said no one accessed the files unless Kost was present in the office. Kost said when Kost was the City Administrator the personnel files from employees who left the city’s employment stayed in the same locked file as current employees.

Kost told the investigators Kost specifically dealt with Tim Kingman’s personnel file because he had several open complaints to complete when Kost took the position of City Administrator. Kost said Kost dealt with Tim Kingman’s file because there were complaints that dealt with Joel Halminiak, Tony Gilman and Tom Roeser. Kost said there would documents in both Kingman’s file and the other employees’ files as Kost prepares a document that explains the results of the investigation.

Kost told investigators when Kost resigned it was very quick. Kost said Kost left everything as it was and packed only his personal items. Kost said Kost left the key to the office and the key to the building with his administrative assistant, Stephanie Rajnicek when Kost left the building.

Kost said when Daniel Guild was hired as the new City Administrator; Kost met with Guild and answered questions for Guild. Kost said at one point, Kost received a phone call from a city employee who was told by Guild to call Kost and ask if Kost could provide the location of a file about the Golf Course. Kost told the employee where Kost believed the file was located. Kost said he never received any phone calls or requests about the location of the Tim Kingman personnel file.

Kost is believe to be truthful and reliable in that Kost was a city employee, and is giving information about the duties he performed.

9. On October 22, 2019, Captain Young and I interviewed Stephanie Rajnicek. Rajnicek was employed as the City Administrator's Assistant from July 2017 until May 2019. Rajnicek worked for Kost and Guild as an Administrative Assistant. Rajnicek said when Rajnicek worked for Kost, the key to the filing cabinet were the personnel files were kept were kept in Rajnicek's desk. Rajnicek said Rajnicek could not access Kost's office unless Kost was present. Rajnicek said when Guild took over as the City Administrator, Guild asked Rajnicek for the keys to the cabinet and Guild kept the keys in his possession.

Rajnicek is believe to be truthful and reliable in that Rajnicek was a city employee, and is giving information about the duties she performed.

10. On October 24, 2019, Captain Young and I spoke with Rhinelander Police Chief Gauthier. Gauthier had been present at a meeting on September 9, 2019 when Guild discussed with the Rhinelander City Council the Tim Kingman personnel file. The item had been addressed on the agenda as "53. Discussion/action regarding missing employee or former employee personnel records regarding missing records and/or documents." Gauthier said Guild reported to the City Council that when Guild became the City Administrator; Guild found items were missing from Tim Kingman's personnel file. When asked, Gauthier reported Gauthier and the Rhinelander Police Department had not received a report of a burglary or criminal damage to the cabinet the file was supposed to be kept in. Gauthier said this was also when Gauthier had learned that items were missing from the file located in City Hall.

Gauthier is believe to be truthful and reliable in that Gauthier is a city employee, and is giving information about information he received while performing his duties.

11. On October 18, 2019 and October 24, 2019, Captain Young and I interviewed George Kirby, Rhinelander City Council Chairperson. Kirby told investigators that Kingman was fired on June 24, 2019 after a city council meeting. When asked if Kirby had viewed Kingman's personnel file or documents that would have been in the file in order to make this decision, Kirby said they did not look at the personnel file or any other documents. Kirby said when Guild came to the city council on September 9, 2019 and told them the Tim Kingman's personnel file had been missing since Guild began with the city of Rhinelander in September 2018, Kirby was confused. Kirby said Kirby asked Guild why Guild had not told the council sooner that the file was missing. Kirby said Guild told Kirby that Guild did not want to bring it up. Kirby told investigators that there had been on going issues with Kingman since Guild had started as City Administrator that would lead Kirby to believe Guild was dealing with the personnel file and Kirby did not understand why Guild had not told the city council

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
that the file was missing. Kirby said the files are kept in the City Administrator's office and only the City Administrator has a key.

Kirby told investigators Kirby had worked with Miljevich on a committee while there was not a City Administrator to investigate employee complaints. Kirby said Kirby knew documents for these complaints would be found in the complaining employee's file as well as the employee's file that was being complained about. Kirby said Kirby participated in investigations involving Kingman and several other employees to include Tony Gilman, Tom Roeser, and Justin Ernst.

Kirby is believe to be truthful and reliable in that Kirby is a citizen representative providing information to law enforcement about duties he performs and information he received while performing his duties as the Chairperson of the City Council.

12. I know that Tampering With Public records and Notices is a felony crime described in Wisconsin State Statute 946.72(1).

WHEREAS, the said Teresa M. Hook, prays that a search warrant be issued to search such premises for the said property, and to bring the same, if found, before the said court (or, before the Circuit court Oneida County,) to be dealt with according to law.
